A DEVOTIONAL AND A PRAYER · MORNING, NOON, AND NIGHT IN THE NEW LIFE

*Ko e Hā Kuo Pau Ke U Fai Ke Fakamo'ui Au — 'a e Tu'unga*

### TALATEU

*The Foundation study answered the great question, what must I do to be saved? This devotional is for the person who has obeyed that answer. Salvation (being saved by God from sin and from death) does not end on the day you are baptized. It begins on that day. This devotional walks with you through one whole day of the new life, morning, noon, and night (Psalm 55:17).*

### POONI — KUMI VAVE MAI KIATE AU

**A. Saame 5:3** Ko hoku le'o te ke ongo'i 'E Sihova, 'i he pongipongi; 'i he pongipongi te u 'ohake 'eku lotu kiate koe, pea u hanga hake. [H6186 arak ■]

**KO HOKU LE'O TE KE ONGO'I 'E SIHOVA → 'I HE PONGIPONGI TE U 'OHAKE 'E KU LOTU KIATE KOE, PEA U HANGA HAKE.**

**B. Tangilāulau 3:22** Ko e me'a 'i he 'alo'ofa 'a Sihova 'oku 'ikai te tau 'auha, koe'uhi 'oku 'ikai ke ngata 'ene manava'ofa. [H2617 chesed ■] (23) 'Oku fo'ou ia 'i he pongipongi kotoa pē, 'oku lahi ho'o angatonu.

**HANGE HA FANAU FO'OU + HOLI KI HE HUUH MĀ'OMĀ'ONI 'O E FOLOFOLA → KOE'UHI KE MOU LAHI AI.**

*(My personal thoughts — this morning, remember that you woke up as a person God has saved, and his compassions are new again this morning (Lamentations 3:22-23). Jesus rose up before daylight to pray, so speak to God before you speak to anyone else (Mark 1:35). Then feed on the word of God the way a newborn baby feeds on milk.)*

### NOON — PEA 'I HE HO'ATĀ TE U LOTU AI

**A. Saame 55:17** 'I he efiafi, mo e pongipongi, mo e ho'atā, te u lotu, mo tangi le'o lahi: pea te ne ongo'i hoku le'o. [H6672 tsohar ■]

**C. Kau 'Aposetolo 2:46** Pea na'a nau 'alu loto taha ki he falelotu lahi 'i he 'aho kotoa pē, mo nau tofitofi mā 'i he ngaahi fale, pea kai 'enau me'akai 'i he fiefia mo e loto ta'ekākā **[G4342 proskartereo ■]**  
**CONTINUING DAILY WITH ONE ACCORD → DID EAT THEIR MEAT WITH GLADNESS AND SINGLENES OF HEART.**

*(My personal thoughts — at midday, stop for a short time, because Peter prayed on an ordinary roof at an ordinary hour of an ordinary day (Acts 10:9). The first believers continued daily, not one day of the week (Acts 2:46). Say the morning verse again in your heart, pray a short prayer, and then go back to your work.)*

**B. 2 Kolinitō 13:5** 'Eke kiate kimoutolu, pe 'oku mou 'i he tui; 'ahi'ahi'i 'akimoutolu. 'Ikai 'oku mou 'ilo, 'oku nofo'ia 'akimoutolu 'e Sisu Kalaisi, 'o kapau kuo 'ikai 'ahi'ahi'i mo si'aki 'akimoutolu?

**EXAMINE YOURSELVES, WHETHER YE BE IN THE FAITH + PROVE YOUR OWN SELVES → JESUS CHRIST IS IN YOU.**

**[H983 betach ■] [H7965 shalom ■]**

**I WILL BOTH LAY ME DOWN IN PEACE, AND SLEEP → THOU, LORD, ONLY MAKEST ME DWELL IN SAFETY.**

*(My personal thoughts — tonight, examine yourself with honest eyes, whether you are still in the faith, and confess any sin to God before you sleep (2 Corinthians 13:5). Jesus is called the vine, which means the living plant that gives life to every branch joined to it, and a branch at night does no work but only stays joined (John 15:4). So stay joined to Jesus, and then lie down in peace, and sleep (Psalm 4:8).)*

## KO E FOLOFOLA KE FUFUU 'I LOTO

**Saame 119:11** Kuo u fufū ho'o folofola 'i hoku loto, koe'uhi ke 'oua na'aku angahala kiate koe.  
**[H6845 tsaphan ■]**

**FAKAKAUKAU FAKA'OSI**

**Teutalonome 6:6** Pea ko e ngaahi lea ni, 'aia 'oku ou fekau kiate koe he 'aho ni, 'e 'i ho loto ia:  
**[H3824 lebab ■]** (7) Pea te ke fa'a ako 'aki ia ki ho'o fānau, pea te ke talanoa 'aki ia 'oka ke ka nofo 'i ho fale, pea 'oka ke ka 'alu 'i he hala, pea 'oka ke ka tokoto hifo, pea 'oka ke ka tu'u hake.

**THESE WORDS SHALL BE IN THINE HEART → WHEN THOU LIEST DOWN, AND WHEN THOU RISEST UP.**

*Morning, noon, and night are not three separate duties. They are one whole walk with God through one day. Salvation begins in the truth. It continues in the truth, one ordinary day at a time. Let the word of God rise with you in the morning. Let it steady you at noon. Let it lie down with you at night. Pray without ceasing (1 Thessalonians 5:17).*

**APLIKASI 'O E 'AHO NI**

1. This morning, before you eat, read the morning verses out loud one time. Then thank God for one new mercy. A mercy is a kindness from God that you did not earn (Lamentations 3:23).

2. At noon, stop your work for two minutes. Say a short prayer right where you are, the way Peter prayed at the sixth hour (Acts 10:9).
3. Tonight, before you sleep, examine your day. If you find sin, confess that sin to God before you sleep (2 Corinthians 13:5).
4. Tonight, say the memory verse out loud until you can say it with your eyes closed (Psalm 119:11).

## KO E LOTU

*My Father in heaven, I thank you for saving me. I did not earn salvation. You gave salvation to me through Jesus Christ your Son. Hear my voice in the morning. In the morning I will direct my prayer to you, and I will look up. Your compassions never fail. They are new every morning. Great is your faithfulness. Make me hungry for the pure milk of your word, so that I may grow. At noon I will pray, and you will hear my voice. Help me continue daily, with gladness and singleness of heart. At night I will remember you on my bed. Help me examine myself, whether I am still in the faith. If I find sin, help me confess that sin and turn from that sin. Help me stay joined to Jesus, the true vine, because apart from Jesus I can do nothing. I hide your word in my heart, so that I will not sin against you. Keep me from growing lukewarm. Keep my love for you burning, morning, noon, and night. Help me endure to the end, so that I may be saved. You have given me a living hope. You keep me by your power, through faith, to salvation. So I will lay myself down in peace and sleep. You alone, LORD, make me live in safety. Amen.*

**BEGOTTEN US AGAIN UNTO A LIVELY HOPE → AN INHERITANCE RESERVED IN HEAVEN FOR YOU → KEPT BY THE POWER OF GOD THROUGH FAITH UNTO SALVATION.**

*(My personal thoughts — God began your salvation, and he keeps it by his own power. So walk with God every morning, every noon, and every night. Your hope is reserved in heaven, and it does not fade away.)*

## LEA MĀHINO FAKAKALESI

**“milk” — G1051 gala — milk ■**

*the word of God is the first food of the new life*

**“tupu” — G837 auxano — to grow, to enlarge ■**

*the newborn child of God grows by the milk of the word*

**“pray” — G4336 proseuchomai — to pray to God, to worship ■**

*Peter prayed on the housetop at the sixth hour; an ordinary hour of an ordinary day*

**“continuing” — G4342 proskartereo — to continue in, to give oneself continually ■**

*the first believers gave themselves to God daily, not one day of the week*

**“examine” — G3985 peirazo — to test, to examine, to prove ■**

*the saved person tests his own heart each night*

**“Fakamo'oni” — G1381 dokimazo — to test, and by testing to approve ■**

*the testing is done to approve, not to condemn*

**“nofo” — G3306 meno — ke nofo, ke tolonga, ke nofo ai, ke hokohoko atu ■**

*the branch bears fruit only while the branch stays joined to the vine*

“**Alo‘ofa**” — **G1656 eleos** — mercy, compassion ■

*God saves according to his abundant mercy*

“**again**” — **G313 anagennao** — to beget again, to give new birth ■

*God has given the saved person a new birth to a living hope*

“**amanaki**” — **G1680 elpis** — 'Amanaki, falala ■

*the living hope stands on the resurrection of Jesus Christ*

“**mālohi**” — **G1411 dunamis** — mālohi, ivi, iu ■

*God's own power keeps the saved person to the end*

## NGAAHI LEA MĀHU'INGA FAKAHEPELŪ

“**direct**” — **H6186 arak** — to set in order, to arrange ■

*the morning prayer is laid out in order before God*

“**'alo‘ofa**” — **H2617 chesed** — 'Ofa, 'aloha'ia, ongo'i 'ofa

*Ko e ngaahi 'alo'ofa 'a Sihova 'oku ne ta'ofi ai kitautolu mei he 'auha.*

“**Ho‘atā**” — **H6672 tsohar** — malama tu‘o ua, ho‘atā, ho‘atā mo‘oni

*Ko e houa ngingila taha 'o e 'aho ko e houa lotu foki ia.*

“**fakalaulauloto**” — **H1897 hagh** — ke ngungutu, ke fifili, ke fakalaulauloto ■

*the night watches are for remembering God on the bed*

“**peace**” — **H7965 shalom** — peace, wholeness, welfare ■

*the saved person lies down in peace*

“**safety**” — **H983 betach** — safety, security, a place of refuge ■

*the LORD alone makes the sleeper dwell in safety*

“**Fufū**” — **H6845 tsaphan** — to hide, to treasure up ■

*the word is treasured up in the heart against sin*

“**loto**” — **H3824 lebab** — the heart, the inner man ■

*the words of God are to live in the heart all day*
